







COME HOME TO THE NEW HAMILTON

Hamilton is home to more than 100 waterfalls tucked behind the trails of the Niagara Escarpment, an arc-shaped ridge that cuts through the city. Here's a hand-picked selection for your upcoming expeditions, all situated just a few minutes away from 1 Jarvis.





BEST HIKING TRAILS

Hamilton has a vast trail network connected to local, regional and national trails. It includes waterfront routes, lush valleys and the Bruce Trail - the longest marked trail in Canada - that winds along the edge of the Niagara Escarpment.

Nature's calling. And it's a local call.

CHRISTIE LAKE TRAIL

10km of trails through meadows and towering pine forests. There's also a great mountain bike single-track trail that cuts through the forest.

ERAMOSA KARST TRAIL

4km of trails filled with underground caves and streams, meadows and forests.

DEVIL'S PUNCHBOWL TRAIL

2.5km of trails with views of a colourful, rocky gorge that is part of the Stoney Creek escarpment, and the popular Devil's Punchbowl falls.

WATERFRONT TRAIL

7.5km of trails along the shoreline of Hamilton Harbour from Princess Point (Cootes Paradise) through Bayfront Park and the West Harbour.

SASSAFRAS POINT TRAIL

3.4km of trails that are part of what's known as Cootes Paradise, an 840-hectare sanctuary for animals, birds, and marine and plant life.

ESCARPMENT RAIL TRAIL

8.2km of trails with the main route paved and on a gradual slope, which makes it perfect for families on foot and with bikes. This path was established in 1993 on an old CN rail line.

EXPLORING BY MOUNTAIN BIKE

Hamilton also offers a wide selection of scenic bike routes for two-wheel lovers. These off-road suggestions will take you straight into whatever challenge you're up for. Not far away from home, though.

MUSEUM OF STEAM & TECHNOLOGY

Housed in a 160-year-old Waterworks, this National Historic Site preserves two 70-ton steampowered water pumping engines, perhaps the oldest surviving Canadianbuilt engines.

MCMASTER MUSEUM OF ART

1280 Main St. W.

The Museum houses McMaster University's permanent collection of more than 6,000 objects that encompass the history of art from the late 15th to the 21st century.

HAMILTON SIGNATURE SIGN

71 Main St. W.

Bringing life and colour to the forecourt, and putting Hamilton in the spotlight, the sign is 60 feet long by 6 feet deep with letters at 90" tall and 24" deep.

LIUNA STATION

360 James St. N.

An architectural masterpiece, the classic extravagance of this station, including walls of oak panelling and Versace draperies, is testament to rail travel's eminence years ago.

PIGOTT BUILDING

36 James St. S.

Hamilton's first skyscraper, and one of the first in the province, this 18-storey Art Deco/Gothic Revival style building is designated under the Ontario Heritage Act.

DUNDURN CASTLE

610 York Blvd.

Offering a glimpse into the past, this 40-room Italianate-style villa was built in the 1830's on Burlington Heights, the former site of a fortified military encampment established in 1813.

CHRIST'S CHURCH CATHEDRAL

252 James St. N.

Constructed in stages from 1852-1873, the cathedral is a significant example of an English Decorated Gothic church. It was originally a stuccoed wooden Palladian-Baroque structure.




COOTES PARADISE NATURE RESERVE





It offers domestic flights around Canada or to destinations throughout the U.S.A., Mexico and the Caribbean. Originally a wartime air force base when it was constructed in the 1940s, it opened to the public after World War II.
