An architectural feat of glazed black brick designed to “cascade” down the building façade, Alias reinvents the southwest corner of Church Street and Richmond Street East.

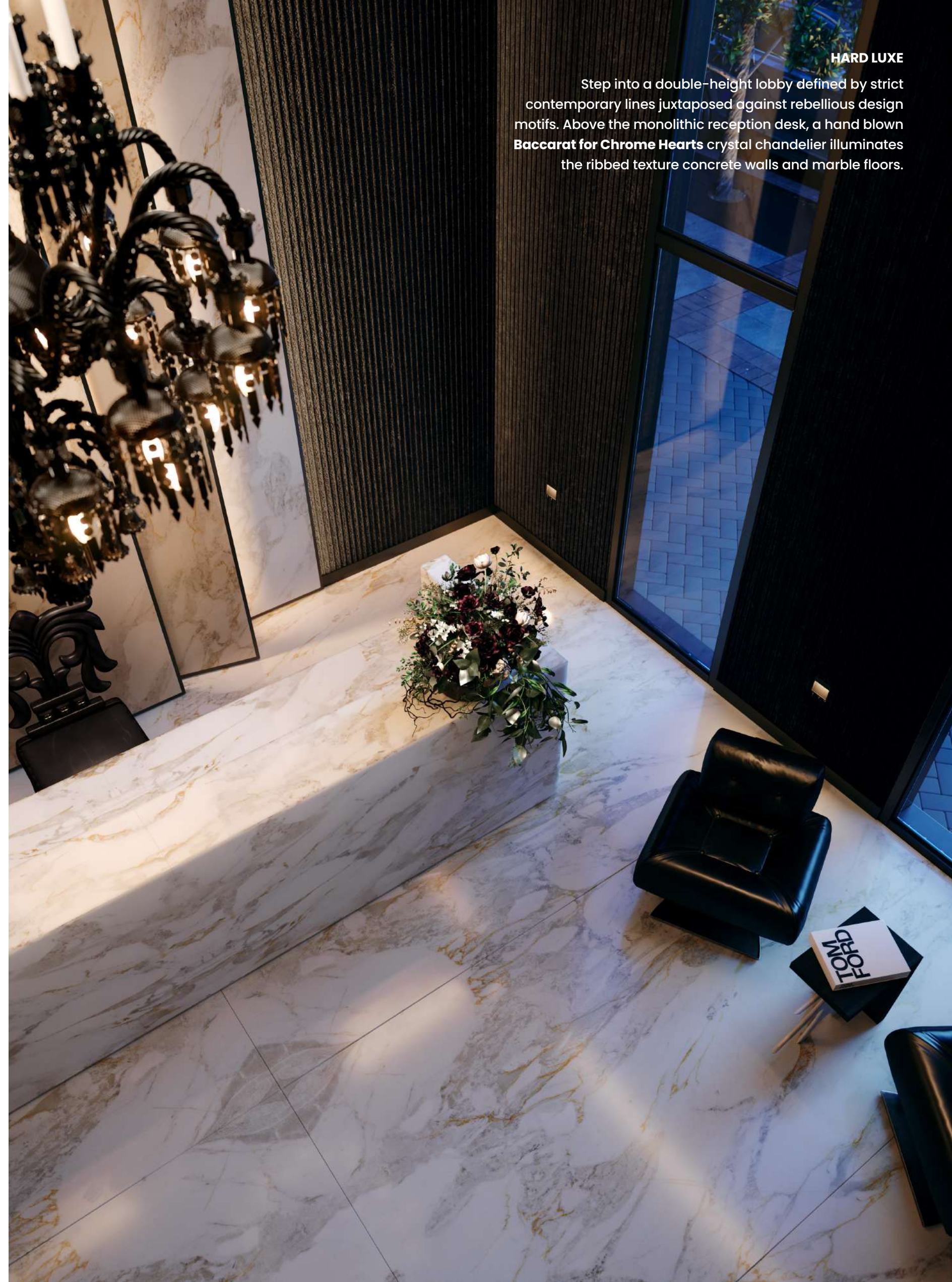
